SUNDAY 26th Seventh Sunday after Trinity 1 Kings 3.5-12; Psalm 119.129-136; Romans 8.26-end; Matthew 13.31-33,44-52; Pray for those living in Meadoway and Meolsgate Avenue; give thanks for our Cathedral Church, the Dean and Canons, and its ministry to the diocese; pray for wisdom and inspiration as they respond to the changing requirements in managing the restrictions imposed by the pandemic.
